Register for FOCUS 2:

- 1. Go to the Career Services Website at www.vmi.edu/careerservices
- 2. Click on the "Cadets" link on the left side of the webpage
- 3. Click on the "Online Career Resources" link.
- 4. Click on the "FOCUS 2" link.
- 5. Click on the "Register" button below the log in area.
 - Use the access code keydet to register.
 - Use your VMI email address as your email and your username.

Log into FOCOUS 2:

- 1. Go to the Career Services Website at www.vmi.edu/careerservices
- 2. Click on the "Cadets" link on the left side of the webpage
- 3. Click on the "Online Career Resources" link.
- 4. Click on the "FOCUS 2" link.
- 5. Use your username and password to log into your account.
