

“Stonewall” Jackson’s Virginia Map Exercise

- 1) Locate and label the following regions of Virginia: the Blue Ridge Mountains, Coastal Plain, Piedmont, Appalachian Plateau, and Shenandoah Valley.
- 2) Locate and label the following bodies of water: the Atlantic Ocean, James River, Rappahannock River, Roanoke River, and Potomac River.
- 3) Locate and label the following cities and towns: Lexington, Manassas, Fredericksburg, Chancellorsville, Winchester, Richmond, Williamsburg, Petersburg, Spotsylvania Courthouse, and Washington D.C.
- 4) Circle these major battlefields in red, blue, or black. Use red for a Confederate victory, blue for a Union victory, and black for a drawn battle (see chart below for battle names and outcomes): First Manassas, Second Manassas, Fredericksburg, Petersburg, Chancellorsville, and Spotsylvania.
- 5) Using an atlas, draw the Virginia-West Virginia border. When was West Virginia created and why?
- 6) Locate and highlight Jackson’s hometown, Clarksburg (now WVA).
